CALL TO ORDER:

Dr. Martin called meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. and a quorum was established.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes from 4th Quarter – October 2, 2020 meeting were submitted. Motion to accept minutes as written was made by Dr. Lisa Nored and seconded by Willie Blackmon. Motion carried unanimously by members present.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:

Dr. Martin announced that we have several positions on our advisory committee that need to be filled. He introduced Lakeisha Bryant-Hall, current President of the MS Association of Juvenile Detention Professionals. Motion was made by Katrina Phillips that we accept Lakeisha Bryant-Hall as a stakeholder member until the new appointment letter can be obtained from the Governor. Motioned seconded by Toni Kersh. Motion carried unanimously by members present.

Dr. Martin then asked for possible youth members that would be active participants on the committee. Tia Grisham, Toni Kersh and Marc Fomby stated they had candidates. Dr. Martin requested that they forward their contact information to himself or Katrina Phillips. A formal review of the membership would be conducted in the upcoming days and a new letter submitted to the Governor or Bureau Director.

STAFF UPDATE:

Emberly Holmes announced that Fred McGee is no longer the Federal monitor and they have submitted to have that position filled. They have interviewed several for the JJ Specialist/RED Coordinator position and hope to have someone in place soon.

The three-year plan has been submitted to OJJDP.

RED/GRANTS COMMITTEE:

Three grants were given out during this past grant cycle – YMCA for after school program; MS Hope Institute – training of the MS Division of Youth Services staff on the science of Hope; Boys Club – program.

Next RFP cycle will be coming up soon. Dr. Martin asked if there are program areas or programs that work that we can target. Dwayne Nelson suggested the Behavioral Mental Health Courts. Toni Kersh suggested prevention grants to school districts. Mack Pampley suggests staying with the community-based groups due to the amount of money we have to offer. Gloria Salters and the committee will meet and begin to prepare the RFP. Dr. Martin charged the members with looking for programs that are working in the different communities and report back to the Committee.

ANNUAL REPORT:

Willie Blackmon reported that he still needs a short paragraph from each committee for the annual report. Mr. Blackmon and Katrina Phillips are working to find another intern to assist with the report and social media.

LEGISLATIVE:

Judge Broome announced that last year only bill of interest that passed was no child younger than 12 could be disposed to the training school or detention. It did not limit pretrial for detention. No measures on horizon yet for 2022 session. Judge Broome requested input from members on needed reforms.

PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Katrina Phillips announced that the business cards had been ordered at no cost through the DPS print shop since MSJJAC is DPSP affiliated. Ms. Phillips also stated that a questionnaire is in the works for the Judges to be able to highlight on FB page and website. Dr. Nored has another intern in mind and will get the information to Mr. Blackmon and Ms. Phillips

CONFERENCE 2022:

Dr. Martin announced that we had a great planning meeting on Thursday. Dr. Martin reminded everyone to get their speaker contact information to Marc Fomby as soon as possible. Conference dates are March 23 – 25, 2022 at Golden Nugget. DPS is working on the contract with the hotel.
